Preamble

Read By Rev. Simon Reed

From the beginning of the Church in AD33, it has been very important to set people apart to hold positions in the Church to maintain peace and order, and to ensure the physical expansion and the unity of the body of Christ.

Since the days of the apostles and throughout the Scriptures, God has used sacred offices and ministries to guide the Church to the fulfilment of its earthly purpose. The earliest records of ancient Christian writers have included Holy rituals that have given the Christian Church its character and majesty.

The Old and New Testaments contain depictions of God's design and relationship with the Church. The New Testament in particular, gives points that outline the character and duties of the post-Resurrection Church. The Scripture highlight the orders of ordained ministries that give expression to the character of the Christian Church.

The New Testament and Book of Common Prayer outline the use and purpose of these sacred offices. The order of Bishops are those who are called to lead, oversee and unite the Church. They guide and teach others to fulfil Christ's Commission in the world. The Presbyters or Elders are charged to govern, shepherd, proclaim the Gospel, administer the Lord's ordinances and strengthen the Church's missionary zeal. The Deacons assist the Bishops and Pastors in all areas of the ministry, including but limited to ministering to the sick, poor, and disenfranchised. The Church recognises those who are capable and called by God and ordains them to work of the ministry.



Their ability and gifting is acknowledged through ceremonial prayer and the laying on of hands. Those who are called are forever associated with the redemptive plan of God, for peace and them to work of the ministry. The act of consecration is a public affirmation of the servant's call and pledge of lifelong commitment to the cause of Christ and the Church. The chronicles of these ancient offices date back to the first century. Each Bishop receives their consecration through the laying on of hands.

This act confers upon the recipient the history and purpose of the office. Bishops are consecrated by other Bishops who are qualified to confer upon the recipient the rights and responsibilities of the office. This threefold ministry is a blessing from God for the edifying, nurturing, and sharing of the Gospel throughout the world.

Those, whom God calls, are publicly set apart by Him for a special work. Our Bishop-Elect, Joan Asiedu Larbi joins the long-standing tradition of those called to serve the greater Church. This is the reason that we have gathered here today.

Bishop-Elect Joan Asiedu Larbi is a co-founder of Messiah Church. She is the daughter of the late Reverend Jonas Asiedu Larbi and Dora Asiedu Larbi of the Senior Ministers of Apostolic Church in Mamprobi, Ghana. The Presiding Archbishop Dr. A. C. C. Evangelou

Addresses all present:

Honoured guests, Officers of Ixthus Church Council, Bishops Ministers, Pastors and Church Members and Friends, We are gathered here today in the presence of Almighty God to consecrate Bishop-Elect Joan Asiedu Larbi to the office of Bishop.

I call upon the Adjudicators to present the Bishop-Elect.

The Adjudicators present the Bishop-Elect:

Reverends, Archbishops and Bishops we present the **Bishop-Elect Joan Asiedu Larbi** to be consecrated to the office of Bishop of the Christian Church.

The Authority

The Presiding Archbishop:

Let the Authority for the consecration be read.

The Authority is read.

Reading of the Authority

The Presiding Archbishop presents the Bishop-Elect to the people, saying:

Those who have authority to do so have chosen Bishop-Elect Asiedu Joan Larbi as a woman of godly life and sound learning, to be a Bishop in the Church of Christ. It is therefore your will that she should be consecrated to that Office.

The People say:

It is.



Moderator:

Will you uphold her in ministry?

The People say:

We will.

Moderator:

I call upon the representatives of Messiah Church of which the Bishop-Elect is the Leader, to pledge that the Ministry will strongly support their new Bishop.

Do you, the representatives of Messiah Church of which the Bishop-Elect is the Leader, pledge, on your own account and on behalf of the members and Officers of the Ministry, to support your new Bishop, willingly and in gracious service, in prayer, in finance, and in faithfully carrying out the work of the Ministry both in his/her presence and also when she is absent engaged in the duties laid upon her as a Bishop of Church,

The Ministry Representatives:

We pledge, on our own account and on behalf of the Ministry, to support Bishop-Elect Joan Asiedu Larbi as she carries out the duties of a Bishop in Messiah Church, in prayer, in finance and in faithfully carrying out the work of the Ministry as directed by her.

The Bishop Assisting:

The Pentecostal Churches are part of the one, holy, universal and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. They profess faith in Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God and Saviour of humankind, and in the Holy Spirit. They profess the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the Creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, they have borne witness to Christian truth in the midst of suffering.

In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to



this inheritance of faith, as your inspiration and guidance under God, in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making Him known to those in your care?

The Bishop-Elect declares:

I, Bishop-Elect Joan Asiedu Larbi do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the universal creeds and which has been witnessed to in the midst of suffering. I will uphold that faith in public worship and prayer and administration of the Sacraments.

The people sit.

The Presiding Archbishop:

Therefore, Bishop-Elect Joan Asiedu Larbi, it is necessary for me to wash your feet as our Lord did to His disciples in St. John 13.

Bishop-Elect:

Why do you wash my feet?

The Presiding Archbishop:

It is the will of our Lord that if I do not wash your feet, your mission is not accomplished.

Bishop-Elect:

Then wash my feet.

The Presiding Archbishop washes the Bishop-elect's feet.

The Bishop Assisting:

The Bishop is called to lead in serving and caring for the people of God. As Chief Pastor, she carries a special responsibility to maintain and further the unity of the Church, to uphold its discipline, and to guide its faith. She is to promote its mission throughout the world. It is her duty to watch over and pray for all those committed to the up building of the Church and to guide them after the example of the Apostles.



She is to baptise, to preside at Holy Communion, and to lead the offering of prayer and praise. She is to be merciful, but with firmness, and to minister discipline, but with mercy. She is to have a special care for the outcast and needy: and to those who turn to God, she is to declare the forgiveness of sins.

The Presiding Archbishop says to the Bishop-Elect:

In order that we may know your mind and purpose, and that you may be strengthened in your resolve to fulfil your ministry, you must make the declarations we now put to you.

Do you believe, as far as you know in your own heart, that God has called you to the Office and work of Bishop in His Church?

Bishop-Elect:

I believe that God has called me.

The Presiding Archbishop:

Do you accept the Holy Scriptures as revealing all things necessary for eternal Salvation through faith in Jesus Christ?

Bishop-Elect:

I do so accept them.

The Presiding Archbishop:

Do you believe the doctrine of the Christian Faith as the Church has received it, and in your Ministry, will you expound and teach it?

Bishop-Elect:

I believe it and will do so.

The Presiding Archbishop:

Will you accept the discipline of the Ixthus Church Council and will you faithfully carry out the tasks laid upon you in accordance with the Vision of Unity and obedience to Christ?



Bishop-Elect:

By the help of God, I will.

The Bishop Assisting:

Will you be diligent in prayer, in reading the Holy Scripture, and in all studies that will deepen your faith and fit you to uphold the truth of the Gospel against error?

Bishop-Elect:

By the help of God, I will.

The Bishop Assisting:

Will you strive to fashion your own life and that of your household according to the way of Christ?

Bishop-Elect:

By the help of God, I will.

The Presiding Archbishop:

Will you promote unity, peace and love among all Christian people, and especially among those you serve?

Bishop-Elect:

By the help of God, I will.

The Presiding Archbishop:

Will you then be a faithful witness to Christ to those among whom you live, and lead your people to obey our Saviour`s command to make disciples of all nations?

Bishop-Elect:

By the help of God, I will.

Bishop-Elect:

By the help of God, I will.



The Presiding Archbishop:

Almighty God, who has given you the will to undertake all these things, give you the strength to perform them: that He may complete that work which He has begun in you: through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Moderator:

I invite you Bishop-Elect Joan Larbi about to be consecrated as a Bishop, and the representative of his/her Ministry to sign the declarations they have just made.

The Moderator speaks to the people:

In the name of the Lord Jesus, I commend Bishop-Elect Joan Larbi to your prayers. Do not fail to uphold her at all times as she undertakes the task laid upon her. Let us all stand to join together in prayer for the Bishop-Elect and for the ministry of the whole Church.

Let us pray.

We praise and glorify you, Almighty Father, because you have formed throughout the world a holy people for your own possession, a royal priesthood, a universal Church.

We praise and glorify you because you have given us your only Son, Jesus Christ, to be the Apostle and High Priest of our faith, and the Shepherd of our souls.



We praise and glorify you that by His death He has overcome death; and that, having ascended into heaven, He has given gifts abundantly to your people, making some apostles, some Prophets, some Evangelists, some Pastors and Teachers; to equip them for the work of the ministry and to build up His body.

Now we give you thanks that you have called this your servant, whom we now inaugurate in your name, to share this ministry entrusted to your Church.

Deacons to present the oil

(The Archbishops and Bishops lay their hands on the Bishop being consecrated and the Ministers stretch forth their hands towards her). The Presiding Archbishop:

Send down your Holy Spirit upon your servant, Bishop-Elect Joan Larbi for the office and work of a Bishop in Your Church.

The Choir sings:

Spirit of the Living God, fall afresh on me, Spirit of the Living God, fall afresh on me, Fill me anew, Fill me anew Spirit of the Living God, fall afresh on me.

The Presiding Archbishop continues in prayer:

Almighty Father, fill this, your servant with the grace and power, which you gave to your apostles that she may lead those committed to his/her charge in proclaiming the Gospel of Salvation. Through her increase you're Church. Renew its ministry, and unite its members in a holy fellowship of truth and love. Enable her as a true Shepherd to feed and protect your flock; make her wise as a teacher, and steadfast as a guardian of its faith and sacraments. Guide and direct her in presiding at the worship of your people. Give her humility that she may use his/her authority to heal, not to hurt; to build up, not to destroy.



Defend her from all evil, that as a ruler over your household and an ambassador for Christ, she may stand before you blameless, and finally, with all your servants, enter your eternal joy.

Accept our prayers, most merciful Father, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and your Holy Spirit, belong glory and honour, worship and praise, now and forever. Amen.

The people sit.

The newly consecrated Bishop stands.

The Vesting

The Presiding Archbishop presents the vestments to the newly consecrated Bishop.

The Cassock:

The Bishop is wearing a cassock; the robe of a servant. This garment modelled after the one Jesus wore is the garment they gambled over as He hung on the cross

The Bishop's Band:

Being placed around her waist is symbolic of truth, which Jesus girded Himself and began to wash the disciples feet and said to us wash one another's feet. Paul also admonishes us in our spiritual Armour to put around our waist the truth.

The Stole:

I present to you this Stole, a symbol of extra care and awareness of duty and ministering in your calling as a faithful Steward of the Most High God, who has given you this Rank of Excellence and Nobility for His Glory.



The Bishop's Cope:

A symbol of the prophet. In the days of the Prophet Elijah they called it the prophets Mantle. You knew immediately that he was God's messenger. As the Priest carries the Prayers of the people to God, the Prophet carries the Word of God back to the people.

This Bishop stands in the twofold office as Priest and Prophet.

The Mitre:

The Mitre is the symbol of the Bishop's Authority for her ecclesiastical Headship and Christian Leadership in the Universal Body of Christ. It is a sign of distinction and God's delegated Authority.

The Shepherds Staff:

It reminds the Bishop to shepherd her people with her Staff, the flock of her God's given heritage with love and care as she imitates the Lord Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd of our souls.

The Pectoral Cross:

Suspended by a golden chain, Jesus' cross was not this fancy, but we cherish the symbol. It is made of gold, which is the most enduring non-tarnishing material. The chain that is suspended by it, is not for jewellery or decoration, but represents the chains of a prisoner, for we are prisoners of the Lord Jesus Christ.

The Ring:

The ring is a sign of son-ship. It also indicates that one is a Prince in the family of God. The ring is gold, which symbolizes that one has been tried in the fire.

The Bible:

My dear sister, to keep you ever mindful of the law and the Gospel of God as the Rule for the whole life and government of the New Covenant Church, we present you with this book, the most valuable thing that this world affords. Here is Wisdom.



This is the law of God. These are the lively Oracles of God. Be diligent my sister to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of truth.

Read it, learn it, and teach it in season and out of season.

The Pen:

Always agree with the Psalmist to say that: "My heart is overflowing with a good theme; I recite my composition concerning the King; my tongue is the pen of the ready writer". Use the Pen to write the Vision, for it will come to pass.

The Briefcase:

I present to you this case in which, as you travel in the name of Jesus, you may carry many messages of the will of God, even as the boy who carried the five loaves and two fishes.

The Presiding Archbishop:

Bishop-Elect Joan Asiedu Larbi, on this occasion of your taking up the obligations of the office of Bishop, we invite you to come to the Table of the Lord and receive Holy Communion, and thereafter administer the Sacrament to the people.

The Presiding Archbishop: Lift up your hearts.

People:

We lift them up to the Lord.

The Presiding Archbishop:

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People:

It is right to give Him thanks and praise.

The Presiding Archbishop:

Father, all-powerful and ever-living God, it is indeed right, it is our joy and our Salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks and praise through Jesus Christ your Son, our Lord. You created all things and made us in your own image. When we had fallen into sin, you gave your only Son to be our Saviour. He shared our human nature, and died on the cross. You raised Him from the dead, and exalted Him to your right hand in glory, where He lives forever to pray for us.



Through Him you have sent your holy and life-giving Spirit and made us your people, a royal priesthood, to stand before you to proclaim your glory and celebrate your mighty acts.

Therefore, with all the company of Heaven we join in the unending hymn of praise:

People:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the Highest. Blessed is He who comes in the Name of the Lord. Hosanna in the Highest.

The Bishop Assisting:

We praise you, Lord God, King of the universe, through our Lord Jesus Christ, who, on the night in which He was betrayed, took bread, gave thanks, broke it and gave it to His disciples, saying, "Take this and eat it". This is my body given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it all of you. This is my blood of the New Covenant, poured out for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me."

People:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The Bishop Assisting:

Therefore, Father, as He has commanded us, we do this in remembrance of Him, and we ask you to accept our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Grant that, by the power of the Holy Spirit, we who receive your gifts of bread and wine may share in the body and blood of Christ. Make us one body with Him.

Accept us as we offer ourselves to be a living sacrifice, and bring us with your whole creation to your Heavenly Kingdom. We ask this through Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.



People:

Through Him, with Him, in Him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be given to you, Almighty Father, from all who dwell on earth and in Heaven throughout all ages. Amen

The Bishop Assisting breaks the bread, saying:

The bread we break is a sharing in the body of Christ.

People:

Though we are many we are one Body because we all share in the one loaf.

The Presiding Archbishop:

Lord, we come to your table trusting in your mercy and not in any goodness of our own. We are not worthy even to gather up the crumbs under your table, but it is your nature always to have mercy, and on that we depend. So feed us with the body and blood of Jesus Christ, your Son that we forever live in him and him in us. Amen.

The Presiding Archbishop gives the bread to the new Bishop, saying:

The Body of our Lord Jesus Christ, which is shed for you, keep you in eternal life. Take and eat this in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on Him in your heart by faith with thanksgiving.

The Presiding Archbishop gives the wine to the new Bishop, saying:

The blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, which was shed for you, keep you in eternal life. Drink this in remembrance that Christ`s blood was shed for you, and be thankful.

The newly Consecrated Bishop invites the people, saying:

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ, which was given for you, and His blood, which was shed for you; and feed on Him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.



Those who desire to receive Communion come forward, row by row, as direct by the Stewards.

The Bishop is assisted by other Ministers and designated persons.

After all who desire have partaken the Bishop prays, saying: We thank you, Lord, that you have fed us in this Sacrament, united us with Christ, and given us a foretaste of the Heavenly banquet prepared for all mankind. Amen.

People:

Thanks be to God.
